- (vii) Name the main protagonist of 'The Fire Dwellers'.
- (viii) Name two Canadian Dramatists.

- 6) Write short note on the theme 'The Moon' in Atwood's works.
- 7) Compare and contrast the personalities of Hagar's two brothers in 'The Stone Angel'.
- 8) Discuss 'The Fire Dewellers' epitomises the dehumanising, hellish state of urban enistence?
- 9) Throw light on 'who do you think you are?' as an autobiographical novel.
